Purpose Question:

OPENING FRAME

Grace is never passive. Grace confronts injustice, tells the truth, and seeks reconciliation without denying pain.

BIBLICAL ANCHORS (NLT)

Micah 6:8 – Do justice, love mercy, walk humbly.

Romans 15:13 – God as the source of hope.

2 Corinthians 5:18–19 – The ministry of reconciliation.

TEACHING MOVEMENTS

1. Hope That Refuses to Die

Hope is spiritual defiance and confidence in God's promises.

2. Justice as Gospel Responsibility

Justice is love in public. Faith demands action.

3. Reconciliation Without Cheap Peace

True reconciliation requires truth, repentance, and change.
